arate himself from the rest of the (Rat) pack, Triola has enlisted a singer and Sinatra fan named Betsyann Faiella for the six-night stand A Jazz Tribute to Frank Sinatra. August 12 through 17. "She doesn't do the obvious licks, the pointing, all the bullshit," Triola says with a bluntness Frank would appreciate. "This is going to be classy, not some sort of Elvis tribute." He's also stocked the band with Sinatra vets like Johnny Blowers, Benny Powell, and Frank Wess. "These guys span the entire breadth of Sinatra's career." Triola says, "the sessions at Capitol, Reprise, and Columbia-everything. This is for the real fans, the kind of people who will come up to the players and say, 'What was it like to play with Frank at the Columbia sessions? "The band-centric approach of Triola's tribute conforms to his take on the master. "Sinatra was not a singer; he was an event." he says, "and events go on forever." (See "Jazz.") E.B.
